

Dear Mr. Hollo:

The County of Lambton and the City of Sarnia have retained M.M. Dillon Limited, Consulting Engineers, Planners and Environmental Scientists to develop a comprehensive, long term waste management plan. The plan, following the requirements of Ontario's Environmental Assessment Act, will consider a wide range of waste management systems for the handling, processing and disposal of domestic, commercial and non-hazardous industrial wastes generated in the County of Lambton.

Newsletter Number One of the Master Plan Study is enclosed. It outlines the study purpose and provides information about the intended content of the Master Plan.

The first of the three stages of the Master Planning Process is currently being initiated. Stage One of the process will examine the existing waste management system including its financial and administrative structure in the County. Possible alternative waste management system components and areas suitable for their location will be identified. Stage One will be completed in the summer of 1986. Stage Two will involve the evaluation of alternative system components. It will be completed in the winter of 1986/1987. Stage Three will involve the development of the Master Plan itself and it will be completed in the fall of 1987.



To assist in the collection of information on the existing waste management system in Lambton County, we are enclosing a questionnaire. This questionnaire requests information on current conditions and systems in your municipality. We ask that your municipality collect the information requested, complete the questionnaire and return it to M.M. Dillon Limited, P.O. The County of Lambton and the City of Sarnia have agreed to jointly undertake the development of their Waste Management Master Plan with the assistance and participation of the Ontario Ministry of the Environment. M.M. Dillon Limited, Consulting Engineers, Planners and Environmental Scientists have been retained by the County and City to assist in the preparation of the Plan.

The purpose of this study is to prepare a Waste Management Master Plan which will provide a comprehensive, long range waste management plan to serve the needs of the County of Lambton and the City of Sarnia.

Developing a plan for the management of waste in Sarnia/ Lambton which incorporates the best approach and takes into account public health and safety, economic, financial, social, cultural, technical, land use and natural environmental perspectives is the goal of the study. The study is being conducted in accordance with the requirements of the Environmental Assessment Act.

The Master Plan will identify the most economical and environmentally sound systems for the handling, transportation, processing, and disposal of domestic, commercial and non-hazardous industrial waste generated in the County of Lambton and the City of Sarnia. The Plan will address the opportunities for waste reduction, source separation and material and energy recovery as integral components of the waste management strategy.

A comprehensive review of all waste management options will be undertaken. The Plan will outline the best approach to waste management in the County of Lambton and the City of Sarnia and the best methods and programs for implementation of the Plan.

Public participation is an important component of the study. The Plan will incorporate public concerns and priorities about waste management in the County and City. To encourage input from the citizens of the County and City, open houses will be held at key points on the study. These open houses will allow public review and comment of the study as it progresses. Notices announcing the dates and locations of open houses will be published in the local media.

Thank you for your recent notice (86 02 28) on the above noted project. In response to your letter, I would like to take this opportunity to advise you of this Ministry's typical concerns related to waste management studies and to clarify the procedure used by the Ministry for the coordination of external environmental assessment reviews.

From an environmental standpoint, this Ministry will generally have no concerns or comments to make on potential waste management sites and alternatives. The Ministry's concerns relate primarily to site access and the effects of sites on the adjacent road system and, in this regard, we presume your study will have a transportation component to address these matters.

Generally speaking, any coordinated Ministry position/comment is prepared by the Environmental Office. Technical input to your studies would normally come from our Regional Offices.

With regard to other matters, please note the following:

Project Start-up

The Environmental Office should be contacted at the outset of new studies so that it may advise the proponent of other affected MTC offices. The appropriate Regional Office should also be contacted for comments on technical aspects of transportation related matters. The Regional contact for waste management studies is normally the Manager of Engineering and Right-of-Way.

Pre-Submission Reports

Unless otherwise advised, send one copy of all pre-submission reports to the Environmental Office and two copies to the appropriate Regional Office. Where one Regional Office has been designated as the sole reviewer of an E.A., that Region will comment on pre-submission reports directly to the proponent or its consultant and will copy the Environmental Office. Where two MTC offices (besides the Environmental Office) comment on pre-submission reports the Environmental Office will prepare a coordinated response.

In terms of the subject project, your regional MTC contact will be Mr. A. McConnell, Manager of Engineering and Right-of-Way, Southwestern Region. Mr. McConnell's office will comment directly on pre-submission reports and will determine whether or not to attend any external term meetings.

Formal E.A. Submission

Formal E.A.'s are distributed by the Ministry of the Environment to the Environmental Office which in turn will circulate the Region and any other affected MTC offices for input to the Ministry comment.

Data Collection/Clarification

Contact MTC offices directly for data collection or confirmation and clarification of data. The Environmental Office should be copied on any correspondence to keep it informed of the progress of the study.

I attended the Open House to review the Waste Resignment Moster flan process in Sarnia City Hall. I spoke with Jan Varyhers of M.M. Dillon, Quentin Chapman of the MCE, and with Al Patterson. Unfortunately, my time did not allow me to discuss the Flan saray concerns, with you. Thus, I have written this letter.

I would like to receive a copy of the terms of reference for the Waste Management flan process. I understand that the flan will deal only with currently generated waste and expected fitue

municipal maste.

The opportunity to plan for the management of previously disposed waste, and known closed waste sites, should not be overlocked. Further, I believe that the opportunity may exist for co-contration and acceptance of non-hozardous industrial waste at an Energy-From - Waste plant. I feel that these options must be expland.

I was concerned to note that for some of the municipal landfill sites, no operating history was available. Is then information not recorded or has it not yet been obtained by asking the Alie, the site operator, or waste howlers? It seems to me that knowing what materials, and how much of each material is going to the current sites in the only way to begin to plan for the fature. The Ontario waste Management Corporation has conducted record well publicized surveys of waste in Ontario, and the MOF has a thorough tracking system for industrial waster. The property

As I read the descriptions of each existing waste site I was concerned to note that there was not a county-wide attachment of waste monitoring. Essentially no work has been done to find out what propertiens of Lambton's municipal wastes are 1'1" place or metal and suitable for recycling. No work has been done to review what commercial wastes are being deposited that would be recycled. Certainly one aspect of any review, or any proposal than must be the strict monitoring of wastes.

Another concern I had after reading the site descriptions was the lack of a site monitoring standard. Although the current Sainia landfill has some hydrogeological monitoring with very little monitoring has been done at any other site. I will urge you to include strict site monitoring requirements in the

proposed Plan.

Lalso suggest that the proposed flow include an open border" policy, and local industry involvement of particulars. An "open border" would allow the importing of acceptable wester, and the exporting of certain woster. Thus, if the county were to establish, or support, a competent recycler, there would be no politically motivated limitations to his market area. Local industry involvement recognizes that some industrial processes may be able to accept municipal waste as a raw material, or that selected non-hazardous waste industrial waster may make a commercial recycling venture feasible.

I am heavy interested in the Environmental Assessment process. I lock forward to any involvement that may is possible forme in the formulation of the Waste Municipal Master Plan.

The County of Lambton and the City of Sarnia have agreed to jointly undertake the development of their Waste Management Master Plan with the assistance and participation of the Ontario Ministry of the Environment. M.M. Dillon Limited, Consulting Engineers, Planners and Environmental Scientists have been retained by the County and City to assist in the preparation of the Plan.

WHAT IS WASTE MANAGEMENT?

Waste is defined in the Dictionary of Canadian English as "useless or worthless material, stuff to be thrown away". Management is defined as "control, handling, direction". Waste management is simply the process of controlling and handling our useless or worthless material.

A waste management system consists of a number of elements:

- waste collection
- waste handling
- waste treatment
- waste disposal
- a management structure including perpetual care and monitoring

WHAT ARE THE COMPONENTS OF THE SYSTEM?

WASTE COLLECTION

Waste collection components could include:

- Municipal collection: Collection is handled by the municipality (household pick-up, or pick-up from a depot centre).
- No collection: Collection of wastes is not provided. The public is responsible for the delivery of the wastes to a treatment or disposal location.
- Source separation: The separation of garbage into recyclable and non-recyclable components to be collected or delivered to a treatment or disposal location.

WASTE HANDLING

Components of the waste handling element of the waste management system could include:

- Direct haul: Direct delivery to the treatment or disposal location.
- Transfer haul-compacted/uncompacted: Wastes are delivered to a transfer station, and are compacted or directly transferred into a larger vehicle (tractor-trailer trucks or rail cars) for delivery to the treatment or disposal location.

WASTE TREATMENT

Many wastes can be treated to reduce the amount to be disposed, to recover re-usable materials or to produce energy.

Components of the waste treatment element in the waste management system could include:

- Recycling: Wastes which can be reprocessed are recovered and recycled. These include glass, cans, paper, oil and some industrial wastes. A waste processing plant can mechanically separate mixed garbage into recyclable and non-recyclable components.
- RDF (refuse derived fuel) production: Fuels can be derived from wastes using a variety of processes.
- Incineration: A thermal reduction process with a large reduction in the volume of waste processed. Modern air pollution control requirements has rendered incineration to be an uneconomical solution, when compared with EFW technology.
- EFW (energy from waste): Wastes are burned to produce energy in the form of steam or electricity. The energy is then sold to neighbouring markets (for industrial processes, for heating building complexes).
- Composting: The organic material in the wastes (wood, food, garden wastes) are separated and reduced to a usable soil conditioner.

WASTE DISPOSAL

There will always be a need to dispose of the wastes which remain whichever treatment and handling elements are selected. The treatment and handling elements will help to reduce the amount of waste which requires disposal. Two disposal elements could be considered in Lambton/Sarnia's system. They are:

- Landfill: A process for the disposal of wastes on or in the surficial soils by burial with a shallow layer of soil acting as a cover.
- Export: waste generated in Lambton/Sarnia are exported to othe jurisdictions for disposal.

MANAGEMENT STRUCTURE

An important component of the system is the authority for its operation. Components of this element could include:

- element ownership: public versus private ownership of system elements and components;
- financing: system financed through a disposal tipping fee, taxation or other arrangements;
- authority: the allocation of responsibilities for elements and components of the system and the determination of participation of municipalities in the system;
- perpetual care and monitoring: long-term arrangements, including financing, for care and monitoring of the elements and components of the system.

Policies, programs, facilities and sites will be identified and evaluated. The preferred system elements and components, including sites will be identified and the Councils will decide which elements and components will be included in the Plan.
- Public involvment in this stage will help to evaluate the various system elements and components available.

STAGE 3 - HOW WILL WE DO IT?

- Discussion will focus on how we will do it. Stage 3 involves the
 preparation of the Master Plan. The Plan will outline the preferred approaches and elements and components of a waste
 management system for Lambton/Sarnia; means for implementing the system; and a process by which its performance can be
 periodically reviewed and updated.
- Public participation in this stage will help to develop specific policies, programs, facilities and sites; with particular concern paid to meeting the system goals and objectives.

GOALS

To provide a framework for developing and evaluating the waste management system in Lambton/Sarnia, the following goals were developed:

To develop a waste management system which:

- avoids risk to public health and safety;
- · avoids environmental impacts;
- enhances the level-of-service afforded by the waste management system;
- minimizes cost.

These goals will provide a basis for decisions regarding the most appropriate waste management system for Lambton/Sarnia.







I refer to your letter dated June 16 enclosing a copy of the Draft Stage 2A Report for the City of Sarnia and County of Lambton Waste Management Master Plan. I am sorry that you have not had an earlier response.

As you know, the Ministry of Energy reviewed the Draft Stage 1 Report which identified energy from waste and refuse derived fuel as potential system components. We expressed some concern about the level of detail relating to our interests and identified our requirements for additional information.

In our review of the Draft Stage 2A Report we assume that the information requirements identified in my letter dated July 21, 1986 to Mr. Murray will be included in the Stage 2B Report.

It may be useful to remind you at this stage that the Ministry of Energy's review of Waste Management Environmental Assessments focuses on the energy from waste alternative and, if energy from waste is a viable alternative, on the proponent's ability to meet our energy from waste program criteria. These are:

- a secure supply of waste at a reasonable tipping fee
- a dependable energy market
- proven conversion technology

- use of best available control technology
- economic and financial viability
- stable ownership, management and operational structure.

From a planning perspective, a primary objective of your study should be to establish the relative importance of the various system components. The approach outlined in the Draft Stage 2A Report will not enable the municipality to do this. For example, there is no discussion at all on the impacts of landfill which is an essential component of any waste management system.

The report also identifies 4 study goals which appear to have been given equal weighting with no discussion of the validity of that approach. Your study must establish whether each goal and each of the assessment criteria are of equal importance and, if not, what would be an appropriate weighting.

To assist your consideration of this aspect of the study you could consider the Ministry's view that

- none of the system components considered does anything to satisfy the goal "to enhance the level of service afforded by the waste management system"
- no waste management system can "avoid environmental impacts".

The following detailed comments on the Draft Report may also help you develop the next stage of your study:-

- Pg 1-8 the rationale for automatically including resource recovery because of provincial policies is not adequate. For example, provincial policies exist to promote EFW, however, EFW should not automatically be included.
- Pg 3-3 the comment that the scale and scope of source separating initiatives will not affect the choice of system components is not substantiated. Does this assume a certain level of reduction? If so, what is it?
- Pg 3-4 What is the rationale for using the same weighting for all criteria in Table 3.1?

- Pg 3-13 Table 3.3

 The level of waste reduction attributed to RDF relative to EFW is not appropriate. The relative difference should be about 5-8% as a result of ferrous metal recovery with RDF systems.
- Pg 3-15 the ranking of EFW and composting at equal levels for waste reduction is not appropriate. For example, plastics and paper plastic combinations can be readily incinerated but not composted.
- Pg 3-18 the assumption that two facilities will generate more public opposition than one can be misleading.
- Pg 4-4 does "municipal waste" include commercial wastes?
 - what is the rationale for assuming that 80% of municipal waste can be utilized?
 - what is the rationale for assuming EFW operation of 5 days per week rather than 7?

I hope that these comments will be useful and, once again, my apologies for the delay in getting them to you.

Thank you for your comments on our Draft Stage 2A Report (September 29, 1987). At this time, the report has been approved by the City of Sarnia and the County of Lambton and specific changes as a result of your comments will be incorporated into the Stage 2B Report. Our response to your comments proceeds in two steps. First, we will address your broad concerns, and then we will address your specific comments.

Two of the broad concerns identified in your letter merit elaboration. There appears to be a misunderstanding of the role of the Stage 2A Report. While Stage 2 identifies what should be done by the City and County to manage their waste, Stage 2A solely identifies the options. The assessment and evaluation work is carried out in Stage 2B. The relative achievement of the goals of the Master Plan Process by the options is addressed in that later Stage.

Your second broad concern relates to the weighting of factors/goals in the evaluation process. While we do not endeavour to explicitly weight the factors, we do not implicitly weight them all equally. Our approach is to assess-the options based on the factors as defined and identify the major trade-offs. The qualitative arguments used to select preferred options based on discussion of the trade-offs highlight the implicit weighting.

The specific comments in your letter are addressed below:

- Resource recovery/recycling was automatically included in the preferred system since it was seen as an enhancement to any option and the relative desirability of the options would not be altered due to its consideration. The actual level of the resource recovery recycling program was identified as a Stage 3 task; the option to limit 4R's development based on markets, for example, remains a possibility. The assumption that non inclusion of 4R's in the system options would have no impact on the relative preferences of alternatives is tested in Stage 2B.
- The assumption that two waste management facilities would generate more public opposition is reasonable considering the types of facilities examined (EFW, landfill, etc.) and the level of detail of the generic evaluation.
- Municipal waste does not include commercial waste (see Stage 1 report).
- 80% utilization of municipal waste by an EFW facility is based on concurrent Dillon studies including the Regina Waste Management Master Plan.

The other specific comments (level of waste reduction and days of operation) and general concerns not dealt with above will be addressed in the final Stage 2B report.



Further to my initial enquiry of June 7, 1987, please be advised that I have reviewed a draft of the Stage 2A Report for the Sarnia/Lambton Waste Management Master Plan and have the following comments and questions for your consideration.

The report is well written and is very concise in dealing with alternative treatment options. Nonetheless, I feel a couple of things need clarification.

First, what is the main objective of a treatment process (ie energy from waste, EFW) being included in Sarnia/Lambton's waste management?

Second, in Section 4 on page 4 it is explained that only 80% of municipal waste could be utilized in an EFW operation. Does this 80% mean that 20% of Sarnia/Lambton's waste will be recycled or composted or is 20% unsuitable for burning? And, with a recycling system in operation, will there not be a conflict between recycling goals and requirements for economical mass burning and energy production? If so, I believe that recycling initiatives and source separation should be considered in the 2B Stage to ensure overall combatibility of system components in relation to waste management objectives.

Also at this time I would like to request a copy of the Stage 2B Report when it becomes available. Thank you for the Stage 2A Report and this opportunity to comment.

Dear Mr. Allaert:

Thank you for your interest in the Sarnia/Lambton Waste Management Master Plan. We have reviewed your comments and offer the following response.

With regard to your first point questioning the main objective of including a treatment process (i.e. energy-from-waste) in Sarnia/Lambton's Master Plan, the preference in developing a waste management system is to ultimately reduce the volume of waste generated in the system which requires disposal in a facility such as a landfill. Therefore measures/components are considered in the development of the Master Plan which recycle, reduce, reuse or recover, or treat (such as EFW or composting) waste and which results in the reduction in the dependency on disposal facilities such as landfills.

The suitability of any component in the Master Plan is reviewed and evaluated based on the goals established for the Master Plan Process. These goals are:

To develop a waste management system which:

- avoids risk to public health and safety;
- avoids environmental impacts;
- enhances the level of service afforded by the waste management system; and
- minimizes costs.

The consideration of a system which included EFW will be based on its ability to meet these goals. The system which best fulfils these goals will be the system selected for Sarnia/Lambton.

The 80% of municipal waste referred to in Section 4 of the Stage 2A Report reflects the amount of waste which is suitable for treatment in an EFW facility. The remaining 20% represents materials which are not considered suitable for treatment in an EFW facility. Some of the waste is, however, suitable for recycling.

You raise an important point regarding the potential conflict between recycling and EFW. This is an aspect which we are currently considering in our Stage 2B analysis. There is evidence to suggest that each is a distinct function in the system and thet do not necessarily conflict with each other. Our approach to this dilemma will be to set targets for recycling including a timeframe for their achievement, and to then consider the potential for EFW based on the volume of waste remaining following the total implementation of a recycling program and the achievement of the recycling targets. In this manner any potential conflict between the two can be minimized.

We will be pleased to send you a copy of the Stage 2B Report when it has been completed. If you have any additional comments on our Master Plan, please feel free to contact us.


