

About the ELP

What is the Early Learning Program (ELP)?

The ELP helps prepare young children for school by developing five age-appropriate school readiness skills: physical, emotional, social, language and cognitive development. The program is open for ten months during the year - September to June.

- 90% of brain growth happens from birth to 5 years of age.

Who is eligible?

ELP is open to Lambton children between 31 months to four years of age who are not eligible for junior or senior kindergarten. Participation in ELP is free, space permitting. Eligible children can attend up to 12.5 hours per week.

- Your child learns more in the first 3 years of life than an adult does in 10 years. (zero5.org)

How long is ELP?

The ELP is available ten months of the year from September to June. Children can begin participating at 31 months and continue until they are eligible for junior kindergarten.

How much does ELP cost?

Participation in ELP is free, space permitting! Eligible children can attend 12.5 hours per week.

Additional time at the child care centre will be charged according to the individual child care operator's rate schedule.

Some families may be eligible for assistance with the cost of child care beyond the 12.5 hours a week.
